



#### **AI SKILLS ROADTRIP OPPORTUNITY**

**The AI Skills Roadtrip** is an upcoming documentary that will feature three young people as they travel across the country in our bright green RV. Along the way, they'll meet inspiring leaders from a wide range of industries—each using AI in powerful, creative ways. Through these conversations, they'll explore how AI skills are opening doors in unexpected fields, driving innovation, and helping people make a real impact. It's a front-row seat to the future of work—and how anyone can be part of it.

Here's some key information about the AI Skills Roadtrip:

#### • What is the opportunity:

- Next spring, Roadtrip Nation will send three young people on a road trip to meet and interview inspiring professionals who are using AI in impactful ways. This journey will expose them to new career paths, powerful stories, and opportunities to explore how AI can shape their futures.
- The journey will be filmed and turned into a documentary special airing on public television, as part of Roadtrip Nation's long running series.
- Roadtrip Nation will work with participants to make sure this opportunity is accessible, providing a generous stipend for personal expenses, as well as covering travel costs.
   There may also be future paid opportunities after the experience to continue participating in conversations at screenings and events to celebrate the documentary.

#### When is the timing:

- o The application is open from October 14 December 14
- o The road trip will take place in April of 2026
- o Documentary is estimated to air on Public Television in early 2027
