Director's Message: You're Halfway There!

Welcome to Week 8 - yes, you read that right. We've hit the midpoint of our 15-week semester, and you're still standing. That deserves recognition!

Real Talk About Right Now

I know your to-do list is probably overwhelming right now. Papers stacking up. Projects demanding attention. Presentations keeping you up at night. Here's what I want you to remember: this isn't busywork. Every assignment, every late-night study session, every momen of struggle is shaping the social worker you're becoming.

How you show up in the classroom predicts how you'll show up for your clients. So take risks. Make mistakes. Ask the hard questions. This is your safe space to learn and grow.

Next Monday: Indigenous Peoples Day

Take a moment to pause and reflect. The land we walk on, the communities we serve, the culture we're part of - all have been profoundly shaped by Indigenous Peoples.

Want to go deeper? I've shared this piece in my policy class before, and it's eye-opening: The United States is Founded Upon the Model of European Conquest by Roxann Dunbar-Ortiz. It challenges what many of us learned in history class.

Domestic Violence Awareness Month

October holds special meaning for me. My first professional social work job was at a domestic violence agency in rural Wisconsin. It changed my perspective on everything. This issue hasn't gone away - in fact, it remains one of our most pressing social concerns. If this work calls to you, or if you need support, our community is here.

Thank you for attending our community meeting in July when we introduced our new endeavor to create a transitional liv<mark>ing home for single mothers and their children. There</mark> has been quite a bit of movement since then and we're excited to share the progress!

FALL 2025

WE'VE BEEN BUSY!

What's been accomplished so far:

- Amistad Family Services, Inc.'s Board of Directors approved moving forward with leasing a property for our program's home-share residence and are providing initial startup costs.
- · Amistad has agreed to contribute operational infrastructure, fiscal oversight, and expert clinical supervision from licensed mental health professionals.
- · We have submitted grant proposals and we are seeking more opportunities for sustainability funding.
- Members of our steering committee visited a successful single mothers' transitional living program in Artesia, NM called Haven of Hope (HOH). HOH has generously shared their insight, advice, and operational documents with us so that we aren't "reinventing the wheel".

Looking forward to opening our doors in 2026!



Live Your Dream Award application due Nov. 15

Undergraduate female students who are the primary wage earner/source of financial support for their families (including children, spouse, siblings and/or parents) are encouraged to apply for the Live Your Dream Award given by Soroptimist International of Las Cruces. Soroptimist International is a civic organization that seeks to improve the lives of women and girls through education and economic empowerment.

To be eligible, students must have at least one person besides themselves that they are financially supporting. Students from the Las Cruces campus as well as branch campuses may apply.

The award can be used for tuition, books, transportation, childcare or any expense associated with attaining an undergraduate degree. Nine awards ranging from \$1,500-\$2,500 will be given. The local winner will then be eligible for awards of up to \$5,000 at the district level and \$10,000 at the national level.






