In February, Professors Mary Nienow, Susie Facio, and Maribel Tellez along with TWENTY Social Work Students attended "Roundhouse" for the Student Advocacy & Action Day at the Legislature in Sante Fe.

The event was hosted by the Center for Excellence in Social Work at Highlands University and brings together social work students from across the state to advocate with legislators on policy issues important to social work.









Several faculty and students joined at the Las Cruces City Council meeting as Mayor Enriquez proclaimed March as Social Work Month. The proclamation was written by our own BSW student Andres Uribe who is an intern for Johana Bencomo, an NMSU SSW graduate, and city council member.



Dr. Mary Nienow had the pleasure of attending the HEST Scholarship award luncheon. SEVERAL of Social Work students, Aubrey Caballero, Sara Hipps, Samara Nunez, Graciela Olague, Lesle Esparza Villalpando joined her to be honored by the College and funders for all of their achievements.

In addition, the School of Social Work was able to award nearly \$200,000 in stipends for students completing their practicums! With an additional \$50,000 in scholarships to be awarded soon.

Both articles discuss how school social workers are prepared to be Related Services School Social Workers, and explore state required licensure and preparation differences.
