HOW DO I PREPARE?

- **Update your resume**. Include any experience you have had in speaking to people and customers. Seek resume building help, as needed.
- Think of what to say to introduce yourself and what kind of social work is interesting to you.
- Think of questions to ask the agency that both make you appear interested in them
 and also answer your own questions. (For example, ask: what do your weekly social work
 duties look like in a typical work or Practicum week? What are some projects or skills other
 students like me have completed at your agency?)
- Think of what type of schedule you will have and ask if that sounds like a schedule the agency goes by.

Remember you don't have to know what type of social work you want to do; but show a genuine interest in all types and you may surprise yourself in finding a new interest!



Keynote: Christian Cardenas



Artist Christian Cardenas, part of the duo LxsDos, captures the life and struggles of the El Paso and Ciudad Juárez borderlands through her art and murals. She has collaborated with Rage Against The Machine and created art installations for Coachella, highlighting migration, refugee issues, and social justice.

Dr. Asif Wilson is an Assistant Professor of Curriculum and Instruction at University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. SHE CURRENTLY WORKS AT MEMORIAL MEDICAL CENTER IN LAS CRUCES, NM WHERE SHE WORKS COLLABORATIVELY WITH AN INTERPROFESSIONAL TEAM TO CARE FOR PATIENTS IN THE HOSPITAL AND OUTPATIENT CLINIC. 
