

- Dr. Finno-Velasquez is seeking 3 motivated students for a unique opportunity to attend and assist with a statewide convening for approximately 75 invitees on June 10-11, 2025 in Albuquerque, NM.
- The event will be a full day on June 10th (approx. 9:30am 5:00pm plus a 2 hr reception 5:00pm-7:00pm) and a half day (approx. 8:30am-1:00pm) on June 11th.
- This event will bring together immigrant-serving organizations from across the state to launch a statewide collaborative focused on building capacity, sharing resources, and developing strategic partnerships to enhance service quality for immigrant families throughout New Mexico.
- The event will feature various panels and interactive sessions on topics such navigating the current immigration landscape; sensitive locations, and organizational security; family preparedness and support; networking, and more. Students are welcome to attend convening panels and learning sessions.
- Students traveling from Las Cruces will receive a \$400 stipend to cover the cost of travel and accommodations. Food will be provided (breakfast, lunch, and hors d'oeuvres on June 10th and breakfast on June 11th).
- · Student responsibilities may include assisting with attendee check-in, set up and break down, note-taking for panels and breakout sessions, and other duties to support project staff.
