Dr. DILMA DA SILVA



Talk title: An Overview of NSF's Directorate for Computer and Information Science and Engineering

The talk provides information on the Computer and Information Science and Engineering (CISE) directorate at the US National Science Foundation (NSF). It provides a general overview of CISE's funding opportunities and highlights a few programs to illustrate diverse programmatic approaches. If of interest to the audience, the talk will also cover information particularly relevant to junior researchers.

Dilma Da Silva is a Regent Professor and Holder of the Ford Design Professorship II at the Department of Computer Science and Engineering at Texas A&M University. She is currently serving as Division Director for the Division of Computing and Communication Foundations at the Directorate of Computer and Information Science and Engineering (CISE) at the US National Science Foundation and served as Acting Lead for CISE from December 2023 to May 2024. Her previous roles at Texas A&M include Department Head (2014-2019), Associate Dean (2019-2020), interim director of the Texas A&M Institute of Data Science, and interim director of the Texas A&M Cybersecurity Center. Her primary research interests are distributed systems, operating systems, and computer science education. Before joining Texas A&M, she worked at Qualcomm Research (2012-2014), IBM Research (2000-2012), and the University of São Paulo (1996-2000).

Dilma is an ACM Distinguished Scientist and a Latinas in Computing group co-founder. She was a member of the board of CRA-WP (Computer Research Association's Widening Participation Committee) from 2008 to 2022. She has chaired over 35 conferences/workshops and participated in over 100 program committees. She has published more than 100 technical papers and has 15 patents.

Dilma received her doctoral degree in computer science from Georgia Tech in 1997 and her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of São Paulo, Brazil. She is passionate about enabling the next generation of talent.

Position Summary

Amador Health Center's Behavioral Health Provider will provide ongoing counseling, assessment, diagnosis, and treatment for our patient population, which includes adults and children. This provider will be a collaborative partner in our health and wellness programs, as part of our integrative behavioral health/primary care approach. Services will be provided in-house, by telehealth, at off-site locations, and from our mobile medical unit.

Major Activities and End Results:

- 1. Provide direct patient screening, assessment, diagnosis, and individual and group therapy to our patient population including adults and children.
- 2. Participate in formal/informal mental health and substance abuse meetings and trainings.
- 3. Help provide counseling to our target populations which include, the LGBTQ community, including gender-affirming services to youth and adults, migrant and seasonal agricultural workers, and people experiencing homelessness and/or substance misuse.
- 4. Collaborate with other partners within the organization, including staffing cases and sharing documentation to serve the patient better.
- 5. Keep abreast of behavioral health trends of high-risk populations.
- 6. Comply with quality improvement plans and activities.
- 7. Coordinate with other clinical staff and management on program planning and evaluation.
- 8. Document work with patients into our EHR system and for other requirements.
- 9. Available to assist in resolving crises when they occur.
- Be available to provide services at off-site locations which may involve using own transportation to get to these sites.
