Program Goal: The primary goal of the scholar program is to increase the number of BSW and MSW social workers available to provide services to children at risk of child abuse and/or neglect and their families.

Stipend Amounts for the 2021-2022 Academic Year: BSW Awards:

\$10,000 award/18-month employment obligation

MSW Awards:

\$8,000 award (part-time MSW)/12-month employment obligation \$11,000 award (F/T MSW)/18-month employment obligation

Requirements for Child Welfare Scholars:

A Child Welfare Scholar must:

- Be accepted and enrolled in the BSW or MSW program. This includes part-time students and students who are currently employees of CYFD.
- Be willing to accept employment with CYFD in counties where there is the greatest need for qualified social workers for a specified period of time after graduation based on the terms of your scholar award.
- Complete a one year field placement at CYFD.
- Complete required Child Welfare course requirements successfully with a "B" or better offered though the NMSU School of Social Work.
- Pass a full background check conducted by CYFD.
- Apply for provisional licensure prior to graduation as well as take and pass the licensing exam within 6 months of graduation.
- Have reliable transportation to complete travel requirements for field practicum and employment.

 - o Names of your current social work instructors (if enrolled in social work classes)
 - o An unofficial academic transcript
- Submit your application to the Child Welfare Scholar Coordinator through fax, mail, or email (see contact information below).

Before being accepted as a scholar, applicants will need to:

- Participate in a panel interview comprised of NMSU and CYFD staff
- Pass a criminal background check
- In addition, the references of all applicants will be checked and the applicant's current social work professors will be consulted.
- Verification of reliable transportation to complete travel requirements for field practicum and employment.
